SCIENCE

Pupils will learn about the science relating to blood, organ and stem cell donation



- Pupils will study pathogens and disease, and understand how certain infections can be spread through sexual activity, including HIV, and ways of protecting against sexually transmitted infections, including abstinence
- Pupils will study pathogens and disease, and learn about STIs, including HIV/AIDS, how these are transmitted protective practices, including abstinence, and how to respond if they feel they or others are at
- Pupils will develop an understanding of vaccinations, and the facts and science relating to immunization and vaccination
- Pupils will study pathogens and disease, and learn about Human Defence Responses, Antibiotics and Painkillers, personal hygiene, germs including bacteria, viruses, how they are spread, treatment and prevention of infection, and about antibiotics
- Pupils will learn how to maintain healthy eating and the links between a poor diet and health risks, including tooth decay and cancer
- · Pupils will explore the physical and psychological risks associated with alcohol consumption and what constitutes low risk alcohol consumption in adulthood
- Pupils will learn the characteristics and evidence of what constitutes a healthy lifestyle, maintaining a healthy weight, including the links between an inactive lifestyle and ill health, including cancer and cardio-vascular illhealth
