Education	 Through self-directed themes, pupils will know how to talk about their emotions accurately and sensitively, using appropriate vocabulary Through self-directed themes, pupils will explore how the media portrayals of the human body may present a false ideal of bodily perfection which does not reflect real life and can have a negative impact on the individual Through self-directed themes, pupils will consider the concepts of sexual identity, gender identity and sexual orientation Through self-directed themes, pupils will learn about justice, understanding the impact of their actions locally, nationally and globally, including the knowledge and understanding to ensure that such judgements are well-informed Through self-directed themes, pupils will learn that discriminatory language and behaviour is unacceptable (e.g. sexist, racist, homophobic, transphobic, disablist) and the need to challenge it and how to do so Through self-directed themes, pupils will recognise stereotypes and how they can encourage damage and prejudice Through self-directed themes, pupils will understand the potential tensions between human rights, English law and cultural and religious expectations and practices
