

Due to the current restrictions, the Annuity Fund draws from March onwards have been postponed and will be made at the earliest opportunity.

Latest Developments

Once again, the Vigil Mass on Saturday evening for the Solemnity of Pentecost will be recorded and uploaded onto the Youtube channel **rcchurchesashton** for you to view it on Sunday morning.

Monday of this week is the Feast of Our Lady, Mother of the Church and a recording of the Glorious Mysteries of the Rosary has been made for you to join in prayer, and this will be available on the same channel from Monday.

The following information was received from the Archdiocese on Friday afternoon.

'As far as church reopening is concerned, there is a staged response. We are at **Stage 1**: the closure of our places of worship. **Stage 2**: will be the opening for private prayer. **Stage 3**: will move us towards liturgical celebrations in the presence of small numbers. There may well be a number of other stages.

This is in preparation for **stage 2**: a reopening for private prayer.

The Archbishop has set in place a clear procedure for this to happen. To reopen a church, the Dean will collate all requests for each Pastoral Area. These will be presented to the Archbishop, who will issue a document of permission indicating which churches can open and at what times. No other churches may be opened for any reason other than those so decreed.

In considering which churches should be reopened as part of stage 2 two main points need to be considered:

- 1. A team of volunteers will need to be trained so that we can safely manage the numbers who come and go and the necessary sanitisation that will be needed before and after each visit.
- 2. Is that church usually open? if not this may not be the right time to begin opening outside liturgical celebrations.

Our main concern will always be the safety of our priests and people. For some people there is a real desire to come and pray in church, there will be others who will continue to pray at home and observe the restrictions that will still apply to them.'

Until further information is available as to what the 'necessary sanisation' involves, and what is meant by 'before and after each visit' is it impossible to say whether we will be able to gather a team of volunteers together. Clearly, this cannot be left to the ladies who clean the Church each week, many of whom are still self-isolating.

What is also clear is that, if the current norms for social distancing (i.e. 2 metres apart) are still in force whenever public Masses are allowed to take place, this will severely restrict the number of people who will be able to attend (less than 20% of the normal capacity) depending on which Church is being used. While this may be not be a problem for weekday Masses, it will be for Sunday Masses, and so we will have to consider what measures will be necessary in those circumstances.

No decisions have been made and we await further instructions.

Mass for Bishop Vincent Malone

Archbishop Malcolm McMahon OP will celebrate Mass for Bishop Vincent Malone on Monday 1 June at 4.00 pm in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel of the Metropolitan Cathedral of Christ the King, Liverpool. The Mass will be celebrated without a congregation and will be livestreamed so that his family and friends may join the celebration. Under current restrictions it is not possible to celebrate a Funeral Mass in a church building and Bishop Malone's body will not be taken to the Cathedral. In line with the restrictions, Bishop Malone's funeral will be a private graveside service.

Bethlehem Fund

I received news this week from Fr Rami Asakrieh, the Franciscan Parish Priest of Bethlehem, whom some of you have met, to say that the Basilica of the Nativity has now finally been re-opened to pilgrims, but that the plight of the local population, especially the Christian families, remains very difficult. He is therefore very grateful for the assistance we have been able to provide via our Bethlehem Fund.
