YouTube

Many thanks, once again, to those of you who took the time to send a message after viewing Mass last Weekend, which over 350 have now done on Youtube at **rcchurchesashton**. A further 120 also viewed the Novena service which was uploaded on Wednesday, and this will remain visible for those who wish offer their prayers each week.

Once again, the Vigil Mass on Saturday evening will be recorded and uploaded onto the same channel in time for you to view it on Sunday morning. In addition, Mass will also be recorded on Wednesday evening for the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord, and this may be viewed from Thursday morning. A reminder, though, that, in the present circumstances, this is not a Holyday of Obligation.

The number of subscribers continues to increase steadily and now has reached a total of 445, which is an increase of 31 on last week. This would suggest that we are unlikely to reach the target of 1000 subscribers in order for us to livestream Mass in this way, and so will have to reconsider how we are able to do so by another platform.

Latest Developments

The Catholic Bishops of England and Wales have expressed disappointment after the government said Churches in the U.K. should remain closed until at least July 4. The bishops issued a statement on Monday after the Prime Minister's statement setting out plans to ease the lockdown imposed amid the coronavirus pandemic. The government's plan categorized churches alongside hairdressers, beauty salons, pubs, and cinemas as places that will reopen during "Step Three" of a three-step program.

"The timing and the manner of the opening of churches touches profound sensitivities and spiritual needs. The government's document and statements fail to recognize this," a spokesman for the Bishops said.

The bishops' statement said: "The government's position, established today, includes these steps aimed at opening churches as soon as possible: the establishment of a task force for places of worship, to work closely with 'stakeholders' in ensuring that premises are COVID-19 secure; and heeding the experience of other countries in which churches are already open for worship."

"In dialogue with the Government, the Catholic Church will continue its engagement in this process and has already submitted a detailed plan, in full accordance with public health guidelines, for churches to be opened for private prayer. The Church is ready to play its full part in the task force, understanding that this includes the possible earlier use of churches for private prayer, as a first safe step towards their use for public worship."

A further meeting was due to take place on Friday, so further information may be available by the time you read this. It would seem the hope is for us to be able to open our Churches soon for private prayer, as before, with the celebration of public Masses still some weeks away, and then with certain restrictions, such as the number able to attend. Work has already begun to examine how these restrictions might affect us.
