



Examples of Active Revision

- Mnemonics
- Read and highlight words in exercise books/make notes
- Plan an answer/essay
- Complete activities in revision guides
- Access sites such as BBC Bitesize & complete tasks
- Watch revision videos/YouTube and make notes.
- Make revision cards
- Write key words on Post-it notes
- Complete past papers
- Read, reproduce, review and repeat

Mock Exams and Trial Exams

MOCK EXAMS (December)

- A mixture of questions from different past papers.
- Tailored to the students' progress in the course.
- Results are reported to parents and exam boards.

TRIAL EXAMS (March)

- Actual GCSE papers taken under exact exam conditions.
- Marked using official GCSE grade boundaries.
- Results are reported to students by SLT in envelopes (just as they will be in August).

Supporting Your Child

- Ensure your child attends school regularly
- Keep up-to-date with your child's progress
- Help them get organised and plan revision
- Find an area where they can study undisturbed.
- Ask questions/take an interest in their work
- Test them using their notes; help them to identify areas for improvement.
- Praise them for their achievements
- Reward progress encourage sports etc.
- Stay positive
