We have shared their successes and failures, good times and bad times, friendships and falling outs, generosity and kindness and have really enjoyed their company, seeing them mature into the fantastic young people they are today. It is a privilege to have seen them grow into incredible young people in our 'Eddies' family and I wanted to thank you for trusting us with their care over the last 5 years. I will send them an email today reassuring them that we will all get the chance to gather again at some point.

As this is going to be a prolonged absence and many of them will be starting 'A' level courses in September, could I urge you to keep them working on the GCSE work set by their teachers, which will stand them in good stead to bridge the time between now and the start of their 'A' level work.

On Friday I kept saying this is an 'au revoir' rather than 'goodbye' as I am certain we will all gather again before they move to the next stage in their lives.

I would like to say a heart-felt thank you to the parents who sent me such lovely emails on Friday thanking me and the staff for all of our efforts over the years and/or on Friday. Your support and thanks have always been greatly appreciated.

I hope and pray that you are all safe and well during the ongoing crisis and that we will all get through this with a sense of positivity and generosity of spirit.
