Pupils will develop composing skills through creating and organising musical ideas and complete their free and set brief compositions. Listening and appraising of music from a range of periods, genres and traditions will broaden musical experience and interests, develop imagination and foster creativity as pupils develop their exam technique in preparation for the GCSE examinations.
