## STATUTORY TESTING

During May, our Year 6 and Year 2 children will be undertaking the national standardised tests for their year groups. The Year 2 tests, or quizzes, must be completed during May. We do try to keep them as informal and low key as possible so the children do not worry about them. If you have any questions about the tests please speak to Miss Vause, Mrs Johanson or myself. The Year 6 tests must be undertaken during the week beginning May 13<sup>th</sup>. Please ensure wherever possible the children are in school every day and on time particularly during this week. We do try our best to keep the week as pleasant and stress free for the children as possible, beginning with class breakfast together in the morning. ## **OUTSIDE AREAS**

Please could I remind parent/ carers to supervise their children before and after school and to keep them away from the toys and equipment in our outside areas. Some items are being moved or broken when children are playing with them before they come into school or after they have been collected. Thank you for your cooperation.

### POLLING

On Thursday May  $2^{nd}$ , our school is being used as a Polling Station for the local elections. As in previous years, the school will remain open. The Rainbow Room in the Year1/2 area will be used for polling and will be closed off from the rest of the school. On that day, the Year 1/2 children should come into school through the library entrance. They should also be collected from the library door at the end of the day. The FSU children should school infant come into across the playground and then in through the small gate to the outside area. They should also be collected from the infant playground at the end of the day. This means the pedestrian entrance at the front of school can be used by the voters only. Thank you for vour cooperation in this.

### PARENT WORKSHOP

On Thursday May  $9^{th}$  at 2.30pm, there is a parent's workshop in school for the parents of children in FSU and our Key Stage 1 class. Miss Hulse, Miss Vause and I will be taking to parents about phonics – how we teach the children their letters and sounds. It will hopefully show you what we do in our phonics lessons and how you can support your children at home.

#### **SWIMMING**

Swimming lessons will resume this week (Thursday May  $2^{nd}$ ) for our year 5 children and this term we will also be taking our Year 4 children to begin lessons. The children will need a swimming costume and towel. Long hair should be tied back but the children are also required to wear swimming caps. If your child doesn't have one, they can buy one for £1. We are hoping to have some in school before Thursday so they can get one during the week. Please speak to Mr Brammer if you would like to buy one.

### FIRST HOLY COMMUNION

Some of our Year 4 children have been working hard to prepare to receive the Sacrament of the Eucharist for the first time in the next few weeks.
