The 'Discover' topic is about ... learning through discovery. The children will learn about our local city Liverpool and what it is famous for.

In RE they will be able to use religious words and phrases to describe some actions and symbols used in Baptism and be able to talk about their own experience and feelings of preparing for special occasions.

In English the children will be able to write their own twisted traditional tale which includes: Compound sentences using *and* and *but*.

In science they will be discovering about materials and what they are made from.

What we already know... the children know that their local town is Skelmersdale and that the nearest city to us is Liverpool. They know the names of some everyday materials like wood, plastic, metal and glass.

By the end of the topic we will know (NC)

- Significant historical events, people and places in their own locality.
- How to inspire pupils to create art which demonstrates local knowledge.
- Children will be able to write and punctuate simple and compound sentences using the connectives *and*, *but* and *or*.
- The stories of the Annunciation, the Visitation and the Nativity.

By the end of the topic we will be able to (skills progression)

- Children will be able to write their own set of instructions.
- To know that unison is everyone singing at the same time.
- Explain what rows and columns are in a spreadsheet.
