Discover—Autumn 2 Cycle A

The 'Discover' topic is about ... learning through discovery. The children will be learning that every civilisation any time in history made toys for children to play with.

In English they will read 'Zog' using familiar plots for structuring the opening, middle and end of their stories.

In science they will be discovering about materials and what they are made from.

In RE the children will be discovering about Advent and they will focus on what it means to wait and how we can use this time to prepare.

<u>What we already know...</u> they already know that toys have been made for a long time and that all children enjoy playing with them. They know that we use lots of materials like plastic and cardboard in our everyday lives.

By the end of the topic we will know (NC)

- That modern toys are made from plastic by a machine and often use batteries or electricity to work.
- Know 5 songs off by heart.
- How to identify what a positive learning attitude is.
- How to distinguish between an object and the material from which it is made

By the end of the topic we will be able to (skills progression)

- Punctuate simple sentences with capital letters and full stops.
 Separate words with finger spaces.
- Investigate tone by drawing light/dark lines, light/dark shapes.
- Understand what algorithms are and develop strategies to help find bugs in them

Listen to Christmas music and watch Christmas movies to help you describe the 'feeling' of Christmas.
