Year 1&2 Knowledge Organiser

Create — Summer 1 Cycle B

The 'Create' topic is about ...learning through creation. The children will design, plan and create a clay flower pot. They will learn to use different modelling techniques and painting methods.

In RE they will learn that the gift of the Holy Spirit, which is celebrated at Pentecost, strengthens Christians to share in the mission of the Church and that the Sacrament of Reconciliation grants pardon and peace.

In English the children will write their own animal adventure story.

In Science we will find out and describe how plants need water, light and a suitable temperature to grow and stay healthy.

In computing the children will create pictures using 2paint.

What we already know...the children know how to use a range of drawing and painting materials and have used clay to create models. They know that plants grow.

By the end of the topic we will know (NC)

- How to select from and use a range of tools and equipment to perform practical tasks.
- How to use the suffix *-ly* to turn adjectives into adverbs.
- How to select from and use a wide range of materials and components, including construction materials, textiles and ingredients.
- How to observe and describe how seeds and bulbs grow into mature plants.

By the end of the topic we will be able to (skills progression)

- Design purposeful, functional, appealing products for themselves and other users based on design criteria.
- Describe what it is like to live in Britain.
- Be able to recite a classic poem by heart.
