Dear Parents and Carers

Thank you very much for following our rules when coming to the Christmas performances, it was very much appreciated. It was lovely to see you all there and I hope you enjoyed watching the children. I do feel the children worked really hard to put their performances on and certainly made us all proud. Just another reason why we all love working at St. Edmund's Catholic Primary School. The videos have been filmed, we are just in the process of editing the movies, they will be ready for next week.

We will be sending letters home next week concerning your child's attendance. You will receive a letter which is either gold, green, yellow or red depending on your child's attendance percentage. The following criteria has been applied:

GOLD	Indicates 100% attendance which is fantastic! Keep it up!
GREEN	This indicates your child's attendance is 95% or above,
	which is excellent and gives your child the best chance of
	success in school.
AMBER	Indicates attendance between 90% and 95%, which in
	some cases can cause concern as your child may not be
	getting the most out of school and their progress could be
	affected.
RED	Indicates attendance 90% and below which in some cas-
	es can be a serious cause for concern and your child's
	education can be seriously affected. You may be request-
	ed to attend an Initial Concern Meeting, with
	Mrs.Birmingham and Mrs. Stringman, to improve the situ-
	ation. If however, it does not improve, some cases could
	lead to Fixed Penalty Notices being issued.

Absences related to COVID are not taken into consideration in the final percentage as this would be considered to be unfair. Attendance at school is very important, it ensures that your child does not miss any learning.

Next week is our last week in school, we finish on Friday at 3.15 pm. School will resume 4th January 2022.
