



### This Weeks Spotlight! EYFS

We have had a very busy week in EYFS! We have been learning about the number eight. We have been finding out all the numbers which make eight, which numbers come before and after eight and numbers which are bigger and smaller. We have also been learning the story of 'The Little Red Hen'. We have been learning how to sequence the story and how to retell the story in our own words. We have also been using our newly labelled construction area to build models of cities. We have also included some photographs of our class taking part in yoga lessons. Well Done EYFS you have worked really hard this week.



#### **Classroom News!**

Year One & Two It has been a busy but exciting week in Year 1&2. We have been writing questions, hot seating and using plurals in sentences during our English lessons. In Maths, we have been adding numbers together and using our number bond knowledge to help us cross 10. On Wednesday, we enjoyed using our Geography fieldwork skills to draw our own maps and in Science, we compared the four seasons and discussed everything we have learnt over the last 6 weeks. Have a lovely half term break Year 1&2, you deserve it!

Year Three & Four This week in Year 3/4, we've been creating and evaluating our own shadow puppets. The children have made their puppets using all their knowledge from our light unit in science. In maths, we have been exploring multiplication and division. While in Geography, we've been learning about how volcanoes are made and where they come from. Well done on a brilliant week team and have a lovely half term break.

Year Five & Six Year 5/6 have been very busy once again this week. We have been exploring life cycles a butterfly, dragonfly and a frog in Science. In RE, we have begun our new theme: Eucharist. The children have been exploring memories and how we recall those memories. In English, we have been learning how to write a flashback and planning our story from another culture. In Mathematics, the children are developing their understanding with subtracting fractions and mixed numbers. Our children have become art this week, as we have been exploring the art work of Henri Rousseau and we have been exploring tonal variation .
