Year Five & Six

We have had a very packed week in Year 5/6. We have been completing our Spring assessments, as well as a lot of learning. This week we have explored 6-digit grid references and compass points in Geography. In Maths, we have been doing some tricky subtractions, exchanging 10's and working with 2-digits. In Geography, we learnt more about the equator and the Northern and Southern hemispheres.
