Year EYFS

We have been very busy in the FSU this week. We started our new 'Birthdays' topic in R.E by introducing a box filled with lots of birthday objects. The children were very excited to share all of their birthday stories and practise using some of the new vocabulary that we have been learning such as: celebrate and special. In Maths, the children have been learning about part and whole. We learnt that lots of different things have parts and when they get put back together it makes a whole. The children really enjoyed their P.E lesson this week and practised lots of different gymnastics skills.

Year Three & Four

This week in Year 3/4, we've had a very busy few days completing our assessments. All the children worked very hard and tried their best. During the afternoons, we've had lots of fun in Science. This week, we dissected a plant to identify the different parts; we even got to write on the table in whiteboard pen to help us label the different parts. In our art sessions, we've been using watercolour paints to create our own mosaic designs. We have been practicing the skill of brush control. It can be very tricky, but all the children have tried their very best. Well done on another brilliant week team!

Year Five & Six

Year 5/6 have been working extremely hard this week, as we have been working towards our end of term goals. In addition, we have been investigating 'Commitment' in Come and See. We have looked at the vows incorporated within a marriage and looking at how we uphold these vows and show commitment in a marriage. Within whole class Collective Worship, the children have been reflecting on Remembrance Week and how we remember others. In topic, we have presented our knowledge and understanding of 'What impact did the Anglo-Saxons have on Britain?' The children worked in pairs and completed a presentation to express their understanding to their friends - they were fantastic! In Computing, the children have had a lot of fun, as they have been investigating Online Safety and editing and manipulating images.
