#### Classroom News!

**EYFS** 

This week in EYFS we have been continuing to look at our book; Look what I found at the seaside. We talked about our senses; what we can see, feel, hear, taste and smell. We also spoke about what treasure we have found at the beach in the book. Then in our writing, we wrote sentences to describe a day at the seaside. In Maths, both Reception and Nursery have been exploring patterns. They have created their own patterns and corrected other's mistakes. This week we have also made our final DT piece. The children used the bridges designed last week to help them make their own bridges for cars, people and trains. We worked really hard to make the suspension lines, legs and sides for the bridges. Then on Friday we spoke about our bridges best parts and what we might do next time if we were to make them again.

Year Three & Four

This week has flown. In maths, we looked at statistics, pictograms and barcharts and have been revisiting some of the skills we learnt early in the year making sure they are solid for next year. The year 4 children were given their MTC results and there were smiles all round for results above national average! In English, we finished our Independent Write and created some incredible interpretations on The Spider & The Fly showing off all the aspects of English writing we have been focusing on this year. In PSHE, we discussed the brilliant P.A.N.T.S campaign run by the NSPCC if you havent heard of it check it out - the kids loved the song but beware it's catchy and you'll be singing it all day long. We enjoyed the Yr 5/6 dress rehearsal, had fun in the swimming pool for our last session this year, enjoyed extra play for our super attendance and today we had forest school in the sunshine. What a great week!

Year Five & Six

An extra busy week for year 5/6 this week. We have completed our dress rehearsal for the whole school and our friends and family performance. The children were amazing and the performed fantastically.

In art, the children have created many techniques this week. They have have created a wash using water colours and water, as well as mimicking the art work of Suzie Mackenzie our focus artist. In PSHE, we have discussed keeping ourselves safe and investigating the NSPCC activities in class. We have come to the end of our RE topic for the year and the children completed this with their own thoughts and ideas on freedom and responsibility. #### Blue Peter—Book Badge


