# Four

Year Three & It's been a busy and fun-filled week in Year 3 and 4! In English, we completed our modelled write, and the children have shown fantastic stamina and tenacity. We also explored how to adapt our villains in preparation for our independent writing early next week. In History, we learned about crime and punishment in Victorian times and discussed why Robert Peel created the Metropolitan Police Force. In Science, we investigated the effects of sugary drinks on teeth by conducting an experiment using boiled eggs. In between all this, we've been getting creative for our craft stall, singing at the Concourse supported by family and friends, performing at church, and even taking to the stage. We are all very excited for the fun activities planned for next week!

### Year Five & Six

Year 5/6 have been discovering a range of very interesting information all about the slaves in Ancient Greece. They children have compare the two city states and discussed how the people of both cities lived and how they treated their slaves. The children have also explored the role of women in Ancient Greece and if it was a nicer life for the women of Athens and Sparta.

In RE, the children have been discussing how we get ready for Christmas during the Advent period. They have also explored sections of the New Testament and reading the scripture to see how the Prophet Isiah told the people to be ready for Christ's arrival.
