### **This Weeks Spotlight!**

#### Year One & Two

Wow what a week in Year 1&2! We have been working so hard to prepare for our Nativity performance. We had our dress rehearsal in front of the whole school on Tuesday and our performance for our parents and family members on Thursday. We all had so much fun and enjoyed getting the chance to show everyone what we have been learning. In the classroom, we have been planning our final independent Supertato story in English and in maths we have been partitioning numbers. In history, we looked at the toys the Royal family children played with in the past and also today. We learnt about the history of the teddy bear and compared teddy bears from the 20th century to what they are like today and discussed the similarities and differences. In RE, we spent time looking at Jesus' birth and the Christmas story, linking it to our Nativity. PE was filled with games which included running, skipping and side stepping skills and we have even found time to do some lovely Christmas crafts. Well done Year 1&2!











#### Classroom News!

#### Year EYFS

What a busy week we have had! EYFS took part in the Nativity and they were absolutely amazing. The have worked so hard on learning their songs and remembering when to come on and off the stage. We are very proud of them. In Literacy this week we have been looking at the Nativity story and retelling it with actions to help us remember. Then we used these actions to help us sequence it. In Maths, we have been recapping all we have learnt over this whole term; working on 1 more and 1 less, the composition of numbers to 5 and counting to 10. Christmas crafts have started in our classroom and this week we have made Christingles. We learned all about the different meanings of the parts and why they are given at Christmas time.

Year Three & Four Even with all the Christmas excitement, Year 3 and 4 have still managed to produce some excellent work this week. In English we have completed our modelled write and practised our focus areas: adverbials, conjunctions, expanded noun phrases and inverted commas, ready for our independent write next week. In Maths we have consolidated our learning with mixed addition and subtraction column addition exercises, taking care to present our work clearly. Our history topic is also coming to a close, the year 4 have begun to pull together a newspaper report on the impact the Romans had on Briton and we also made Top Trump cards all about Boudicca. As well as, singing in the school choir, creating marshmallow treats and beautiful tree decorations, it has been a jam packed week! One more to go guys!

#### Year Five & Six

This week Year 5/6 have been developing the own understanding of persuasive texts. The children have been investigating a range of persuasive texts and exploring a range of media adverts and discussing the language used. We also looked at the town of Beddgelert, where are recent legend was based.

In Mathematics, we have begun to discover equivalent fractions, especially non unit equivalents.

In History, the children have investigated how the Viking religion changed from Paganism to Christianity and the process that took throughout history. Finally, the children have been melting, coating, mixing, stirring and designing our goods for the Christmas Craft Cafe hopefully we will see you there.
