This Weeks Spotlight!

<u>EYFS</u>

This week we have been talking about feelings. We used our feelings wheel to identify how we were feeling and then talked about why we felt that way. We read the story of 'Cake' again and talked about how cake felt throughout the story. The children came up with lots of different emotion words to describe how he might have been feeling. We then baked our own delicious cupcakes. We looked at some different recipes on the smartboard and found one that looked very tasty. We read through the instructions and practised doing the actions of mixing, pouring and cracking to help us remember how to make the cakes. Then, on Friday, we got to make our delicious cakes. In maths, the nursery children have been doing lots of counting using numbers to 5. The reception children have been finding different ways of making numbers up to 5. In P.E, the children were practising different skills such as jumping and rolling in a circuit around the hall. The children all listened and did a fantastic job

of waiting their turn.



Classroom News!

EYFS What another great week for Year 1&2! We have started our new book in English called 'Katie in London'. The children have been making predictions, recognising nouns and using coordinating words to join clauses. In Maths, we have been learn-ing about number bonds and improving our number fluency. In Geography, we have learnt about the 4 countries that make up the United Kingdom and also the names of their Capital Cities. In RE, we have been talking about special people in the church and our community. Well done Year 1&2!

Year Three & Four This week in Year 3/4, we've been exploring the text "A Pebble in my Pocket". The story is all about a stones journey from being ejected out of a volcano, surviving dinosaurs, the Ice Age and the Stone Age to end up in a little girl's pocket. The children have been using expanded noun phrases and fronted adverbials to describe what it must have been like for the pebble. In Maths, we've been looking at how to multiply and divide numbers by 2, 3 & 4. The children have worked very hard on this and are able to solve problems using concrete, pictorial and abstract methods. While in DT, we have begun to design our own shadow puppet. Well done on a very good week team!

Year Five & Six This week Year 5/6 have been preparing to write their own debate. The children have watched footage of a debate and investigated modal verbs. They have also explored words that an be used for cohesion to link their ideas together. In Maths, we have been looking at fractions, we have simplified and identified equivalent fractions. The children also, placed the fractions within a number line.

Our RE unit is Mission at the moment, and we have been exploring the liturgies that helped to proclaim Jesus' mission. Year 5/6 have had fun learning how to use an atlas and identifying the continents and oceans of the world, the northern and southern hemispheres as well as the equator and the tropics in Geography.
