## This Weeks Spotlight!

### <u>Year One & Two</u>

What a wonderful week Year 1&2 have had! We have been writing some lovely poetry based on nursery rhymes, learning about rhyming words and how to use them in our writing. In maths, we have been learning lots about numbers up to 20. We have been representing them with counters and cubes and showing them on our rekenreks. In history, we have been talking about where we live and what the features of our house and immediate area are. In computing, we discussed how and why it is important to keep our passwords and information safe and practised logging on and off the computers and laptops. In science, we looked at different objects and what they are made of. Talking about the properties of materials and

what certain objects could be made of. It's been a great start to the school year with lots of wonderful learning happening. Well done Year 1&2!





#### **Classroom News!**

- EYFS EYFS have had a lovely week back in school. The children have been settling in and exploring their new classroom. This week the children have been reading the book Harry and the Dinosaurs go to school and talking about their first day in school. Also, they have been practicing their counting and singing lots of nursery rhymes to help.
- Year Three & Four Hello everyone and welcome back to the start of a new school year,

I am very excited to be teaching the children in year 3 and 4 this year and am pleased to say that all the children have settled nicely into our new routines. In our history topic this term, will be looking at Prehistoric Britain and asking the question 'Would I prefer to be a Stone Age child or an Iron Age child?'. We began by creating giant timelines in the hall to see just how long ago this period of time was. In English we are enjoying the story of Paddington Bear and have already started to show off our writing skills. Our times table routine each day is already showing good progress and the children are enthusiastic about beating their score or the time which is great. Finally, in Science our topic will be on forces & magnets, so far we have been looking at friction and the effects this force can have on objects.

Thank you for your super attendance the week, we are in the lead for best attendance and if we keep this up the pizza party looks promising!

Year Five & Six All the children have settled in well to their new classroom and seem excited and enthusiastic for the year ahead. This week, the children have been introduced to their new History topic for the term (Anglo-Saxons) and we have already had some investigating an artefact - the children came up with some interesting ideas at first.

In Science, they explored a range of materials and discussed their properties and we have also begun our new class novel - The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe. All the children have been imagining what it would be like to be an evacuee, like the main characters in the text. We have also written a letter home, detailed our new home for the duration of the war.
