This week in Year 3/4, we've been exploring the final chapters of our focus text "Stig of the Dump". After reading our novel we started to plan our own story based on the text. We used a story mountain to structure our own narratives. This involved thinking about the opening, build-up, problem, resolution and ending. We then drafted our own story based on this plan.

In PE, we've been taking part in gymnastics. We have been practicing and learning lots of new rolls and movements - it was lots of fun! In Science, Mrs Mitchell has been teaching

us about magnets. This week we've planned and created our own game that uses magnetism.

EYFS

The children in the FSU have been learning about Baptisms this week. We have talked about why we get Baptised and why we celebrate the birth of a baby. In Maths, we have been learning to use 'more' and 'fewer' to describe quantities. In P.E, the children have been gymnasts. They have been balancing on the benches and practising different jumps. Outside, the children have been busy building dens. It was lovely to see them working as a team to build a huge den.

Year One & Two

We have had such a great week in Year 1&2. In Maths, we have been learning about 1 more and 1 less and using tricky vocabulary like 'greater than' and 'lesser than.' In English, the children have been writing diary entries as Toby from our new book 'Toby and the Great Fire of London'. As part of our history topic, we were also lucky to receive a visit from the Skelmersdale Fire Brigade who talked to us about the fire service and how it had changed over the years. The children really enjoyed getting to see the fire engine up close! Well done Year 1&2.

Year Five & Six

Year 5/6 have been playing with words this week (figuratively and literally), as we have been developing our figurative language skills to write a narrative poem. The children have produced some outstanding similes and metaphors to help enhance the detail of the scene in their poem and they have been using elements of repetition and rhyme.

In Mathematics, we have been using our place value grids to help us multiply and divide numbers by 10, 100 and 1000. All the children have been taught how to move the digits to the left for multiplying and moving to the right for dividing by 10, 100 and 1000. We are becoming very proficient at it now.

Our topic session this week has involved some research into the religious changes that took place during the 5 and 6 Century. The children have investigated how Pagan Britain became a Christian country and which Saints helped this process along.

In Music, we had a lot of fun learning the lyrics and discussing the genre of Bon Jovi's 'Living on a Prayer'
