## Year Three & Four

- EYFS This week in EYFS Barnaby Bear has been on another trip. He has been to Egypt! The children explored the country and different artefacts. They have spoken about what they see in pictures and written sentences using all their Phonics knowledge. They have also been using their fine motor skills to become archeologists and dig up different items from Egypt in the sand. In Maths the children have been consolidating their number bonds to ten and have been using socks to count in two's! In our outside area the children have been using the tyres to build dens and climbing frames. They have also been exploring our outside area on a summer scavenger hunt.
- Year One & Two We have had such a great week in Year 1&2. The children have been learning so much in maths and they have all impressed me with their time topic. We even started to talk about directions and how we turn in a clockwise or anti-clockwise direction. In Design Technology, we have enjoyed researching about pop-up books and have been learning to use our new skills to actually make some of the folds and cuts which we will use in our own designs to make our stories 'pop out' from the pages. In RE, we had our rejoice celebration, we made friendship bands for our classmates and enjoyed a chocolate biscuit together.
