# This Weeks Spotlight! Year 3/4

This week got off to an exciting start as eight members of our class proudly represented the school in a dodgeball competition. For some, it was their very first time competing, and they showed tremendous determination, teamwork and sportsmanship throughout—we were all very proud of them.

In English, the children have been enjoying the adapted fairy tale Rumaysa, focusing on creating detailed character profiles for its key figures. Alongside this, our grammar focus has been on using inverted commas for direct speech and expanding sentences with well-chosen noun phrases.

In maths, we have been exploring the connections between the 2, 4 and 8 times tables, noticing how doubling, double-doubling or even triple-doubling a factor helps us find the product. Our TT Rockstars battles have added extra fun and helped build fluency along the way.











In computing, we have been investigating how different fonts and font sizes can influence the reader's experience. The children edited a newspaper front page and experimented with a range of styles to see which fonts created the strongest impact.

In history, we have turned our attention closer to home as we begin learning about Skelmersdale's mining history and the changes that took place in our local area. Throughout all our learning, we continue to focus on working together as a team. Social time has become an important part of our day, where we sit together to talk, share, communicate and enjoy each other's company through games.

#### **Classroom News!**

#### Year EYFS

This week in FSU the children have been learning about Remembrance Day and why it is important. We learnt that Remembrance Day remembers servicemen and women who have fought in wars. The children also made poppies using collage materials and used apples and paint to print poppies onto paper.

In RE this week, the children began our Advent/Christmas topic and we have been learning about birthdays. This week, we talked about what a birthday is and how we celebrate our birthdays. The children enjoyed sharing how they celebrate their birthdays and we even decorated our own birthday cakes with icing and sprinkles!

Reception and Nursery have continued to learn about hedgehogs in literacy, and they have enjoyed learning lots of new facts about hedgehogs. The children also used talk for writing actions to plan a caption using facts we had learnt, and used Kung Fu punctuation to help us punctuate our sentences.

Well done FSU for another super week, keep up the good work!

#### Year One & Two

This week, we have been building on our knowledge of traditional tales in English, with a focus on The Three Little Pigs. There have been some great group discussions and beautiful pieces of writing from the children.

In History, our topic this term is the history of Skelmersdale. The children looked at an old photograph of Sandy Lane from many years ago and asked thoughtful questions about what they could see, where it was, and when it might have been taken. We learned lots about Skelmersdale and the place we call home.

We have also started preparing for our Nativity—exciting times! We've been learning the songs, and I am so impressed that the children already know them all. Each child now knows the part they will play, and we will continue practising over the next few weeks.

#### Year Five & Six

Year 5/6 have been very busy exploring a multitude of biographies this week. The children have discovered facts about Rosa Parks. Walt Disney, Roald Dahl, Katherine Johnson and many more. Each biography has helped the children to understand their purpose and be able to identify the key features of the text. They also planned and completed a fan letter to their own famous person. This week, we have investigated where in the world was the Ancient Greek Empire located. We used atlases to help understanding the geography of Greece. We also attended Skelmersdale Library - here the children created Greek urns and learnt all about the Trojan Horse.

In mathematics, we have begun to discover the world of fractions. The children have done very well developing an understanding of equivalent fractions as well as placing them on a number line. Our RE topic of vocation and been completed and we are now moving onto advent.
