This Weeks Spotlight!

EYFS

In EYFS this week the children were very creative. As part of our topic this term we have been learning about celebrations from around the world. Firstly we looked at the Brazilian carnival that happens before Lent. As a class, the children explored the costumes and music, then they made some carnival masks. Another celebration we looked at was Holi festival. This was very exciting because we found out that it was the festival of colour and people threw coloured paint and water at each other to celebrate! On Tuesday we celebrated Safer Internet Day. The children listened to a story and decided how the little girl felt about different events in the story and how we can stay safe online.

In Literacy the children continued to look at nursery rhymes. Our new rhyme this week was 5 Little Speckled Frogs. We sang the song and then acted it out in the hall, being the frogs and jumped into the pool each time. We then worked on our rhyming words, which was really tricky. We jumped like frogs onto lily pads were the rhymes matched. As a class we then re-wrote the rhyme using a different animal and setting. It was all about 5 Little Speckled Cats on a cozy mat.

In Maths, Reception continued to look at the numbers 6, 7, and 8. We have been finding double numbers and making them using butterflies and ladybirds. On Friday we worked hard on adding two numbers together to make a new one. In Nursery, we looked at the number 5; what it looks like and how we make it. They found 5-sided shapes.



Classroom News!

- Year One & Two We have had a great week in Year 1&2! We finished writing and editing our own versions of the 'Zog' story. The children did such a great job and I really enjoyed reading them. In maths, we have started our addition and subtraction topic. We have been adding to 10 and adding past ten. In RE, we have been learning about the Holy Communion and also practicing the 'Our Father' prayer. In PE, we enjoyed our first cricket session on Wednesday and our gymnastics session on Thursday. In geography, we have been learning about the countries and capital cities of the United Kingdom and in science we compared the four seasons. Have a lovely, relaxing half-term break in Year 1&2. You deserve it!
- Year Three & Four In Maths, we have been measuring in km, m, cm & mm. We challenged ourselves and applied this to various tricky word problems. Problem solving is a skill we are working on, understanding we might not know the answer straightaway but thinking what do we know that will help us to solve the problem.

In English, we finished off this half term with an independent write based on the Iron Man, making sure to include all the grammar elements we have focused on. Mrs Rowlands is looking forward to reading them all over the half term. For Safer Internet day we talked about scams. The children learnt what to look out for, discussed different scenarios and created posters.

We have been very active this week with a brilliant cricket session focused on throwing and catching, a gymnastics session practicing rolls, swimming, skipping and even some Just Dance! Have a wonderful break everyone.

Year Five & Six Year 5/6 have been working hard this week, especially in English. The children have been gathering lots of ideas to help to construct a science fiction narrative after half term. They have explored ideas for an alien character, as well as describing the main character and details within the home. In mathematics, the children are beginning to explore multiplication of 4-digit by 2-digit numbers; some of the calculations have been challenging, especially using a long multiplication written method.

In RE, we have been discovering Jesus sacrifice, by giving his life after the last supper. The children have discussed what they have sacrificed in their own lives and how sacrifices can be made for the greater good. In geography, the children completed an information text on the Amazon basin. They used laptops to research the Amazon basin, discussed our prior learning and we also discussed the impact of deforestation and climate change in the region. Finally, we further investigated the multitude of biomes that are within South America.
