This Weeks Spotlight!

Year Five & Six

Year 5/6 have been very busy again. At the start of the week, we have a fantastic visit to Skelmersdale Library. Here, the children got to explore the children's section of the library; then they went on a scavenger hunt around the library; completed a crossword and finally had to use our clues to pen up locked treasure chests - a lot of fun we had by all.

We have begun our new English unit this week and it has taken the class by storm. We are reading The Invention of Hugo Cabret and they children love it. Each day they are asking if we are reading more , which is lovely to hear. From the text we have explored the new character Hugo and his home in a French train station. We have also discovered lots of themes within the text and discussed the new and unfamiliar language in the book. They also acted out some of the scenes from the text.

On Wednesday, the children had fun outside in the sunshine with cricket. Lancashire Cricket coaches have been developing the children's skills in batting and keeping control of the ball.

In Mathematics, we have been discovering lots of strategies to help the children divide successfully. It was very tricky at first but they did show a lot of resilience, and they got there in the end.

Classroom News!


- EYFS In EYFS this week we have continued to look at our book The Scarecrows Wedding. We created a story map and actions to help us remember the story and then performed it in class. Reception then retold the story in their writing books and Nursery ordered the story using props. In Maths, Reception have been looking at the numbers 9 and 10; finding them and composition. Nursery have looked at height and length; using words like longer, shorter and taller to compare. In class we have looked at families and how all our families are different and that is ok because we love them. Also, we have talked about what we would need to plan a wedding; we looked at wedding invites, cards, a veil and a wedding dress.
- Year One & Year 1&2 had a great time visiting the library on Monday morning. We did a word Two Search, scavenger hunt and colour by number to help free Alice in Wonderland. We have been turning statements into questions during English and in maths, we have been subtracting to and across 10. In geography, we enjoyed learning about maps, why people use them and even created our own of our route to school or a map of our bedroom. In PE, we practised batting in cricket and performed some lovely sequences in gymnastics. Well done Year 1&2!
- Year Three & In English this week, Year 3 & 4 have been continuing their reading and responding Four on the Romans. We have used various sources such as books, websites and videos to research Julius Casear, the Colosseum, Health and Medicine and Food and Drink. The children had a go at blackout poetry which was a new skill, with some fabulous results. In Maths we are concentrating on multiplication and division. We have covered multiplying three digits and understanding the flexibility to multiply factors in different ways resulting in the same product. In geography, we have completed our topic on Sicily by studying the landscape. The children were fascinated by Mount Etna and how it is still an active volcano today and this took our interest further as we began to understand why volcanos erupt and the effects this has on the landscape. Another great week.
