- EYFSWe've had a fantastic week in EYFS! The children performed the Nativity with Year 1 and<br/>2. They were amazing! They worked so hard to learn their songs and we are so proud of<br/>them. In class we have been doing lots of Christmas crafts. We have started our Christ-<br/>mas card and Christmas Crafts Cafe items for Monday. The children also made their<br/>Christingles this week. We learnt the different meanings for each item and what happens<br/>in a Christingle Service. In RE, we have had a chance to reflect on our topic of birthdays,<br/>we thought about what we do when we wait for a birthday and why we get present on<br/>Christmas day. This week is the children's final forest school, they have had lots of fun<br/>exploring the outside area, making tree cookies and Stick Men.
- Year One & Two Wow, what a week we have had! The children have been so busy practising and performing their Nativity to all of our school family. On Monday, we had our dress rehearsal, performing to the KS2 children and on Tuesday, we enjoyed welcoming our parents and grandparents into school and letting them see how hard each child has worked learning their lines, 8 songs and knowing when to enter and exit the stage. They have been absolutely amazing, so professional, supportive and caring towards each other, I could not be prouder of them all! In English, we have been learning about adjectives and using them in our writing to describe characters and events from our book, 'The Jolly Christmas Postman'. In history, we learnt more about the reasons why people moved from Liverpool to Skelmersdale and we even interviewed Mrs Buckley, who with her family moved in 1978 from Kirkby to Skelmersdale. Well done Year 1&2 for a fantastic week!
- Year Five & Six I have been absolutely blown away this week by how hard Year 5/6 are working in their writing. Not only have they completed a wonderful ancient Greek myth, but they have also included elements of action, description and dialogue to help the reader build a really good visual image, as well as used similes to begin a sentence and expand a noun phrase.

In mathematics, we have continued to stretch our brains by using squared, cubed and prime numbers to solve calculations. In History, we have discovered how different life was in Sparta and Athens and investigated aspects of each civilisation. In PSHE, we have been investigating ways to not succumb to peer pressure and make the right choices.
