# **This Weeks Spotlight!**

## **EYFS**

It has been a very exciting week in EYFS. On Monday we had our delivery of eggs and by Wednesday we had 5 chicks! With more hatching throughout the week. The children have been checking on them and making sure they have enough food, water and that they are warm enough. We have been keeping a chick diary where a child writes in it each day and takes a photo of the chicks. As part of our growing topic the children have been linking the chicks with spring and everything that changes. As a class we have planted some cress and put in around different parts of the class to see where it grows the best

In Literacy we have been looking at non-fiction books around the chicks and talking about their life cycle and the difference between a chick and a hen. As a class we have labelled a picture of a chick and a hen then discussed different facts that the children have learned. In their writing, the children used new vocabulary to write fact cards about he different stages of the hatching process.

In Maths, we have been looking at time. The children have spoken about the days of the week and put them in order using our days of the week song. We then spoke about the words today, tomorrow and yesterday. As a class we discussed the different parts of the day; things we do at home and at school and created our own daily routine.













#### **Classroom News!**

### Year One & Two

This week Year 1&2 have been learning about measuring length and height in maths. In PSHE we have been learning more about money. Thinking about the things we need to buy and the things we may want to buy. In English, we have been using all of our recently learnt grammar skills and applying them to our writing. We have been writing letters of apology in role as the Highway Rat, saying sorry to the animals for stealing their food. In RE, we have been learning more about Holy Week. We focused on the events of Good Friday and Easter Sunday. In computing, we thought about the differences between traditional books and e-books and we started to explore the tools of '2Create a Story'. Well done Year 1&2!

### Year Three & Four

This week in Year 3/4, we have been exploring fractions greater than one. The children have been using a mixture of number lines, diagrams and counters to help them solve a variety of different mathematical problems. In English, we have been using our knowledge of direct speech to help create interesting and expressive narratives based around 101 Dalmatians. During our PE sessions, we've been practicing our long jump, quick bounce and hurdles. While in PSHE we have been looking at different jobs and ways to earn money. Well done team on another brilliant week!

### Year Five & Six

Another busy week in Year 5/6, we have finally come to the end of our information texts and the children have written a very detailed non-chronological report on the Everglades in Florida, USA. We will be moving onto limericks next week, which will be fun. In Mathematics the children are now able to add, subtract, multiply AND divide in fractions - I am very proud of the effort that they have put in over the last couple of weeks with the tricky fractions.

Our Geography lessons have been supporting our work in English, as we have been learning about the imp[act for humans on the Everglades and what is being done to help restore this wonderful environment. Finally, we have remembered and celebrated the end of our Unity topic in RE.
