



Dear Parents

This week we have been working on our behaviour policy in school.

Our three main rules are: Ready—Respect—Safe

During this week, we spoke about being 'Ready' and what it means for our school.

We discussed ready in terms of being ready to learn, to listen, to line up and complete our school learning.

We have also been talking about having two ears to listen and one mouth to speak and how we must listen twice as much as we speak. We will then be able to learn more.

I would be very grateful if you could discuss the above with your children, being ready to learn is really important, we want all our children to know more so therefore they need to listen and be ready.

We have implemented 'social time' at the end of the day for every child. This is a 15 minute structured time for the children where they are able to choose an activity with their friends. If your child has been following the school rules, they will receive all of their social time. Those children who do not follow the rules will miss 2 minute units of their social time after being given three warnings. We have been using the language of making the right and wrong choices, and when we make the wrong choice there is a consequence and that is losing social time.

I am a little concerned about what children are watching on Netflix and YouTube, we do have a number of children who have started to talk about the current series on Netflix called 'Squid Game'. This is a '15 rated programme' and is not appropriate for children, some of the scenes in the series are not very pleasant. We do need to be very careful what we are letting our children watch.

Thank you for attending our coffee mornings this week. We will invite you into school at other times during the school day within the school year so you can see your children's books and have an informal chat with the class teachers.

Father Kenny came into school this week to perform a school mass. It was a lovely occasion and the children took part and sang beautifully. He will be back in again on Thursday 18th November at 9.15 to say a mass for our school saint, Saint Edmund's. We will invite our whole school family to the mass so you can join us in prayer.
