This Weeks Spotlight!

<u>Year One & Two</u>

This week Year 1&2 have been describing characters, writing some fantastic questions and making predictions in English. In our maths lessons, we have been subtracting numbers, practising our number bonds to 10 and answering some tricky word problems. Our History topic has had us answering the question 'how we have changed over the years'. We looked at our personal timelines and discussed the events we have experienced and compared them to our teachers. In PE, we have been putting our hopping, skipping and side stepping skills to good use. We did some relay races and played some fun games. In RE, we have

been thinking about waiting for special events such as Christmas and how we and our families prepare for them. This week in

computing, we looked at a way of creating pictograms to record some data and then practised saving our files. We have also started learning our songs and lines for our Nativity show. We are all really looking forward to performing it in a few weeks time. Well done Year 1&2 for another fantastic week of learning!





Classroom News!

- EYFS We have had an exciting week in EYFS! On Monday we came in to a note from someone saying they are sad; it turns out it is Sam the squirrel from our new book the Leaf Thief. He has lost his leaves and doesn't know who has taken them. We have become investigators to find out who is stealing Sam's leaves. We have been writing lists, labelling squirrels and writing speech bubbles. In Maths we have been looking at circles and triangles. We talked about the shapes sides and corners then went on a shape hunt around the school to find triangles and circles. We have also thought about healthy eating and what foods we should eat to keep us healthy. We then sorted the foods from the home corner into healthy and unhealthy.
- Year Three & Four It has been a week of assessments and the children in Y3 & 4 have worked hard recalling facts and skills learnt so far this term. We continue to show a real effort towards our times tables with TT Rockstars and during class exercises, we even sang along with 'Harry Styles'. We have practised our 4 x table thoroughly and its time to double those products and focus on our 8 x tables. More singing in French as we recalled our greetings and if that wasn't enough we have been practising our hymns too ready for St Edmund's Day mass next week. In English we have been learning about the unusual fable of The Green Children and orally retold the story to our partners before recounting it down in our books. We learnt what 'rebellion' meant in our vocabulary lesson and discovered why Boudicca started a rebellion against the Romans in our History lesson.
- Year Five & Six Year 5/6 had a very exciting week this week! Firstly, they complete an experiment using milk and white vinegar. This experience was to check if the materials when mixed could be reversed. Unfortunately, that was not the case, and the children ended up with a white sticky glue it also stank!!! In RE, the children have been exploring advent and how to make an advent wreath.

Our English was getting very exciting also, as the children discovered if their prediction was correct in The Legend of Gelert, and we found out the very sad ending of the legend. in Mathematics, we have been to investigate multiples and factors.
