



New School Timings

The school gates and classroom doors will open at 8.45 am. Children can enter school from this time. The school gates and classroom doors will be locked at 8.55 am. This will enable the children to come into school and settle before starting to learn.

PE Clothing

A gentle reminder about the requirements for PE: long hair should be securely tied back, earrings and jewellery, including watches, must be removed for PE and swimming.

We recommend children come to school without earrings in on swimming and PE days. If not, they must take them out and replace them themselves. Staff are not allowed to take out or put in earrings for the children. Children are responsible for their own earrings if they are taken out at school and should bring a box to put them in.
