Year Three & Four

This week in Year 3/4, we've been exploring the important work that Sean Devereux did in spreading the Good News. Sean was a missionary, who went to Africa to help build homes, protect young people and spread the word of Jesus. In English, we found an old envelope it appeared to be hundreds of years old! When the children opened it up, they uncovered a diary entry from a young man called Henry. Henry was a miner in Tawd Vale Colliery. The children have spent much of this week exploring what life would have been like for Henry.

On Tuesday, we took part in some yoga in the hall. It was lots of fun and very relaxing. Wednesday was lots of fun, as we began to learn how to play 'Happy Birthday' on the ukulele! We then spent the rest of the afternoon looking at self-esteem and why we are all im-

portant. While on Thursday, we had our Saint Edmund of Abingdon day. The day began with a mass delivered by Father Kenny. The children then came back into class to learn more about St Edmund and create their own information booklet. Classroom News!

EYFS

This week we have started our poetry topic and we have been learning Heads, Shoulders, Knees and Toes. The children started as nursery rhyme detectives looking for clues as to what our new nursery rhyme was. Then we learnt our nursery rhyme, making sure we knew where all the parts of the were. During the nursery rhyme we began to miss body parts out, replacing them with the 'm' sound. In Maths the children have been learning about circles and triangles; learning how to compare the two. Then we looked at the position of items and practiced with our small world animals, putting them on, under, in and behind the house we built. Today we had our 1st forest school session and the children loved exploring the area and using the mud kitchen!

Year One & Two

In Year 1&2 we have been learning about verbs and adjectives to help us write some persuasive posters in English. In maths, we have been learning to subtract using part whole models and number lines to support us. In history, we spent time learning about Skelmersdale, pre 1961. We looked at lots of old photographs and compared them to current ones to see how much streets and places had changed over the years. In RE, we celebrated the end of our 'Belonging' topic, remembering the symbols used in the first sacrament of Baptism. On Thursday, we enjoyed Father Kenny's Mass and learning more about our Patron Saint; St Edmund of Abingdon. Well done on a fantastic week Year 1&2!

Year Five & Six

Year 5/6 have been working extremely hard this week, especially in mathematics. The children have been working on long multiplication and they have been learning a variety of strategies to support this - I think their favourite is using the grid method. In English, the children have been gathering all the resources they need to write an explanation text. This week they have been completing their modelled write with Miss Woodruff and next week they will complete their final independent write.

In History, the children have begun to locate and discuss 'Where in the world was Ancient Greece?' We looked at a range of maps ranging over a period of time and discussed how the territory had changed. Our Advent topic in RE has had the children thinking about 'waiting', especially something that they are really looking forward to, eg. Christmas! We also celebrated St Edmund's Feast Day on Thursday and the children were exceptionally well behaved during our mass and the Year 5/6 readers done a fantastic job.
