This Weeks Spotlight!

Year Five & Six

Year 5/6 had a very different week this week. Year 5 have been in class with Miss Hughes during the mornings working on their mathematical and grammar skills. Year 6 have worked extremely hard and have now completed the standardise assessment tests for the end of KS2. The children celebrated on Friday with a pizza from Dominoes, a movie and treats.

During the afternoons, we have been focusing on our alternative's faiths, as this week is Faith Week in school. Year 5/6 have been investigating the religious beliefs and practices of a Muslim. The children have explored the Holy Book of Islam (Qu'ran) and discussed the Five Pillars of Islam. The Five Pillars are used to guide every Muslim's way of life.

In Design Technology, the children have investigated and researched Bear Grylls and they have discussed our brief: 'design and make a meal for an outdoor explorer.' During our research, the children identified a range of very interesting facts about Bear Grylls and how he survives in the great outdoor doors by only foraging. As a result, they children went outside to explore our forest school area and collected a range of herbs, plants and flowers that could be 'edible or deadible.'



Classroom News!

EYFS

This week in EYFS we have started our new topic of people who help us and non-fiction books. We have looked at different jobs and what a day in a life of the person would be like. We have then looked at different emergency service buildings and talked about what materials they are made out of and what shapes we can see. This will help us next week when we build our own structures. This week we have also been learning about Hinduism. We explored different items of a home shrine and built their own, looked at a Mandir and talked about how it is a place of worship and then we learnt about Diwali. The children then created their own Rangoli patterns.

Year One & Two

Year 1&2 have had a great week finishing writing their diary entries in role as Aladdin. In Design and Technology, the children have been learning to do a running stitch. They have amazed me with their sewing skills, patience and resilience. In RE, we have really enjoyed our faith week learning about Hinduism. We learnt about home shrines and Puja trays. Our dance routine in PE is looking really good, the children have tried hard and listened to the instructions to work as a team and create a lovely performance. In Maths, we have started our new topic on Position and Direction. Learning lots of new vocabulary to describe which way we are turning or moving. Well done Year 1&2 for another great week!

Year Three & Four

In Year Three and Four this week, we've explained how primary and secondary colours can alter an image. We stretched ourselves at the swimming baths, and tried a variety of dance steps. We have also explained how Muslims relate their God (Allah) through the Qu'ran, as well as the '99 Names of Allah'.
