This Weeks Spotlight! - EYFS

Lots has been happening in EYFS this week. We continued to look at our story the Storm Whale in Winter and created a story map with actions to help us retell the story. We then looked at the different weather in the book. We described the snowstorm and wrote sentences as a class, using our phonics to help us sound out the words. Towards the end of the week, we started to think about ideas for our own story about a sea animal. Our class story was called the Turtle in Summer. We used all we knew about the Storm Whale in Winter to help us write our own class story. There were lots of fantastic ideas!

In Maths, Nursery have continued to look at the number 3. They have been reading the Three Little Pigs to help them with counting. They then used their knowledge of the number 3 to feed the wolf three items. In Reception we continued to look at numbers to 5. We have explored one more and one less, composition of the numbers and subitising. During our lessons we

have been using both hands to show how they can make the numbers in different ways. Then we used hoops and beanbags to show how numbers were made.

In Geography, we have had the big maps, atlases and globe out in class to explore different places and how they are used. We found our school on Google Earth and then looked at what was around us. In PE we started gymnastics! This week we explored how our bodies can move as different animals.









Classroom News!

Year One & Two

Year 1&2 have had a lovely week. We thoroughly enjoyed watching the pantomime 'Sleeping Beauty' on Monday afternoon. In English, we have written a book review on Zog. Explaining what our favourite parts are and why we like it. In maths, we have started our new topic on shape and this week we have been recognising different 2D and 3D shapes. In Geography, we have learnt the names of the seven continents and their locations. In science, we have been learning about the season of Spring and in RE, we have been learning about gathering together for Mass and recognising Jesus as the most important person for the parish family. Well done Year 1&2!

Year Three & Four In English, the children have delved deeper into the story of The Iron Man and written character descriptions with inference around thoughts and feelings. In Maths, we are making connections between times tables and division. We practised sharing and grouping which can be quite confusing, so we got out the counters and this helped us to see the difference between the two. Forest school was great, the children did some cross-curricular activities with science and looked at different seeds from the season and consolidated prior learning on different types of seed dispersal. The children presented their findings to the rest of the class. Finally, we are enjoying our new PE theme - gymnastics and we were glad to get back in the swimming pool and make a splash!

Year Five & Six

This week Year 5/6 have been exploring lines of longitude and latitude, and they have discovered how this links to the time zones around the world. We had some fun calculating the time zones using atlases. In Mathematics, the children have been converting mixed numbers to improper fractions and vice versa; our times table knowledge really helped to support the children with this skill.

In English, we have been reading a variety of science fiction texts, the children are really enjoying them, and we have been discussing the plot and the theme of each text. We have also been building our skills to write an expanded noun phrases in grammar.

Dear Parents and Carers
