EYFS

Year One & Two

Year 1&2 enjoyed the start of our new English topic this week. We have started reading 'Traction Man' and the children had to feel their way around a sink filled with some disguising food items and then use some great adjectives to describe them. In Maths, we have started learning about multiplication. The children have been counting in 2's, 5's and 10's and looking at equal groups. We also started our new forest school block this week and the children have had a great time exploring and creating in the great outdoors. Well done Year 1&2!

Year Three & Four

This week in Year 3/4, we've been exploring perimeter. The children have spent the week solving mathematical problems relating to perimeter and measurement. On Monday, we were given a selection of different 2D shapes. We were asked to try and find the perimeter of these using our rulers and jottings. It was lots of fun! On Tuesday and Wednesday, we were tasked with solving problems relating to perimeter - our knowledge from Monday's lesson really helped with this. While on Friday, we moved on to more abstract questions. On Thursday, we began building our volcanoes. Skyler brought in lots and lots of newspapers for us all to use, which meant some of our volcanoes became giant! We are all really excited to start painting them next week. Well done Year 3/4 on a wonderful week! Enjoy your weekend!

Year Five & Six

We have only had a short week this week, but the children have fitted a lot of work in. We have explored ordnance survey maps and symbols in Geography and identified the human and physical features around our town. We will finish our Geography driver unit next week with a visit to the Concourse; using a questionnaire the children have developed they will ask a range of questions relating to our local area.

In English, we have begun to explore free verse poetry and listened to a range of poems like to the South America - deforestation. In Mathematics, we have have been developing our skills in finding a fraction of an amount. We have made beautiful spring cards using our deign and technology skills and began to explore the festival of Lent and Easter in RE. We have listened to the scriptures surrounding Jesus' visit to the Garden Of Gethsemane and completed role-play about Jesus' betrayal of Judas.
