This Weeks Spotlight!

Year Three & Four

This week in Years 3 and 4, we've been tying up loose ends and celebrating all we've achieved. In maths, the children recapped their knowledge of graphs, revisiting the x and y axis and practising translating shapes to different coordinates. In English, we revisited prefixes and suffixes, exploring how they change the meaning of root words. In French, we've been expanding our vocabulary around colours and foods, using the phrases "I like" and "I don't like" to create fun and expressive sentences. In music, we've been learning the classic song You've Got a Friend by Carole King. The children reflected on the powerful lyrics, which reminded us all of the importance of friendship and support. A highlight was the middle section, where pupils played a harmonised melody on their recorders using the five notes they've learned this year. It required careful listening, steady rhythm, and soft tones — quite a challenge, but they rose to it beautifully.

We wrapped up the week with a small performance in front of the school, which gave the children a fantastic boost of confidence and a chance to showcase their hard work. With reports and books now sent home, the classroom is starting to look a little empty but there's still plenty of fun ahead next week as we enjoy our final days together. It's hard to believe how fast the year has gone — they say time flies when you're having fun, and that couldn't be more true. My first year at St Edmund's has been a joy, and it has been an absolute pleasure teaching Years 3 and 4.













Classroom News!

EYFS

We have had a busy week in EYFS this week. In phonics, we have been going over our sounds and tricky words and the Reception children have really blown us away with remembering lots, then applying their knowledge to writing sentences. In Maths we have been recapping number bonds to ten using our song and starting to use language like add, take-away and equals. We also enjoyed revisiting some of our favourite nursery rhymes and stories. We have also enjoyed using the magnetic tiles this week to build different structures and animals. On Tuesday, we had our transition morning, Reception met their new teacher Mrs Beeley and Nursery met Miss Fairhurst. Both sets of children had a lovely morning and are looking forward to going to their new classes!

Year One & Two


What a lovely week we have had in Year 1&2. We have spent time learning how to weave in our art lessons. On Monday, we started by weaving paper and then on Wednesday and Thursday we learnt to weave with yarn and wool. We showed great resilience, determination and a positive can do attitude throughout and I am very proud of everyone. In English, we completed our 'story time with Thomas' stories. The children used conjunctions, contractions, new vocabulary and words with suffixes to showcase all of the grammar skills they had learnt recently. In maths, we completed our statistics unit learning about bar graphs and pictograms. In RE, we talked about how Jesus taught us to love our neighbour by sharing and helping each other. One of the ways we can do this is by buying Fairtrade goods so we wrote some messages to tell people why they should buy Fairtrade products. On Friday, we all enjoyed a full day of forest school to finish our week off. Well done Year 1&2 for a great week!

Year Five & Six

Year 5/6 has begun the week with completing many areas of learning from this term. To complete their learning in PSHCE, the children have explored the world of budgeting and looking at how their parents run a household and how sometimes this can be very challenging. Hopefully, this has given the children the understanding that money is a precious commodity. Many of the children have completed most, if not all of their allocated ReadingPlus for the year. We began with a very slow start to the year with our reading and we have got a lot better with reading at home - hopefully this will continue into the new school year.

The children have been designing their own theme park. This project is also linked to money and mathematics, as all the children have to buy specific rides with an allocated budget. Once the budget decisions have been made, they then have to allocate space and calculate the area and location of the said rides.

Finally, we have been celebrating our wonderful Year 6 children. We had a lovely mass in school and the children really enjoyed their bowling, laser quest, food and arcade time in Southport.

Wellbeing Ambassadors


This week St Edmund's welcomed Caitlin from COMPASS Bloom to start working with our new and current wellbeing champions ahead of their training in September.
