This Weeks Spotlight! Year Three & Four

Time flies when you are having fun and wow this half term has flown by! Year 3 & 4 have been working hard all term and this week has been no different.

We have completed our English unit on Paddington and created some fabulous and funny calamity stories in true Paddington bear style which we can't wait to sit and read to the younger classes when we get back after half term. The past two weeks we have dipped into non-fiction writing, recognising key features of leaflet design and finished this week by creating our own tourist leaflets having researched our favourite London landmarks.

In maths we have looked at value of numbers, compared numbers and this week we have finished off rounded numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000. Our mastering number journey continues with our new fluency lessons which are helping us embed those critical mathematic foundations. This week the focus has been on doubling. We have been doing daily times table challenges and weekly class battles and the enthusiasm the children have shown has been wonderful. They have earned extra house points & certificates - keep this up over the half term everyone!

Guided reading and Reading Plus have also been a highlight this term and I am thrilled with the children who have taken this on. You can really see the positive influences their reading has on their work in English but also in other subjects too.

This week our Prehistory topic came to an end, culminating in a huge class debate this week on whether they would rather have been a child in the Stone or Iron Ages. It was wonderful seeing everyone participating and listening to them support their arguments with evidence and new vocabulary they have learnt this term.

As part of World Food Day, our class thought about 'No Food Waste' and what we could do to avoid wasting food. The children brainstormed lots of ideas and created posters to promote this key message.

Finally, in Swimming and PE we are seeing confidence, resilience and skills develop each week which is incredible. Now it's time to enjoy our well deserved Pizza Party for all our efforts in the classroom and superb attendance this half term.


Enjoy your half term break everyone – I can't wait to see what we can achieve next half term.

Classroom News!

EYFS

This week in EYFS we have continued to look at our non-fiction book; A Place Called Home. We wrote a class fact file about a house using vocabulary we have learnt and then we used the book You Choose to choose a home we would love to live in and why. In Maths the we are looking at the numbers 1,2 and 3; how they are represented, how we write them and how they are subitised. For World Food Day we discussed what food we liked and how we should share what we have with others that don't have as much as us. Then the children painted their favourite foods.

Year One & Two

This week Year 1&2 have been writing their own version of the story 'Harry the Happy Mouse'. In history, we have learnt all about the Great Fire of London. We learnt about how and where it started and the reasons it spread so quickly through the city. We completed our jumping, running and balancing unit in PE. In RE, we learnt more about the important people and symbols at a Baptism. Have a lovely half term break Year 1&2, you deserve it!

Year Five & Six

This week in Year 5/6, the children have been completing their independent non-chronological reports, They have designed a wide range of mythical creatures using a range of expanded noun phrase and parenthesis to add extra detail to their creation. In mathematics, the children began the week by investigating column addition. Here the children developed their skills in exchanging amounts of ones for tens or hundreds.

In RE, the children have been discussing the Sacrament of marriage and exploring the words that are used within the vows and what they mean. Our Science focus this week has been investigating separation. The children had a range of mixed materials and they had to decide which would be the best way to separate the two. Finally, we have completed our journey with the Anglo-Saxon children and we have discovered what it was like for a child during this period and how the changes that happened impacted each child.
