This Weeks Spotlight!

Year Three & Four

This week in Year 3/4, we've been learning all about anti-bullying week. On Monday, we came in wearing odd socks. That was to show that all of us are different and unique - it was great seeing all the different types of socks! We then spent the afternoon looking at the different types of bullying; social, cyber, physical and verbal. The children were really mature and came up with lots of different ways in which we could help/advise someone who was being bullied. We followed this up on Tuesday by looking at the difference between a bully and someone who is just being mean or a little bit rude.

In English we have been reading the historical narrative, Queen of Darkness. The story is based on real events and is about Boudica, the leader of the Iceni tribe. The children have been writing descriptions and action openings about the battles Boudica fought. We followed this up in History by looking at a primary source - an article from a Roman Soldier - that described what Boudica looked like. The children used this

description to help them to draw their own pictures of Boudica. As you can see by the pictures - they were brilliant!

Classroom News!

- Year EYFS This week, we have been exploring different ways of making 4. We watched a Numberblock video called 'Stampolines' where number 4 made himself into different lots shapes. We then explored this by doing our own number 4 sponge paintings. In P.E, the children loved doing yoga. We went on a yoga bear hunt adventure. It was so much fun! We have also enjoyed reading lots of stories, singing songs and playing with the playdough.
- Year One & Two Year 1&2 have had a fantastic week. We have planned and started to write our very own 'Zog' stories, I am really looking forward to reading them when they are finished. In Maths, we have started our new topic on addition and subtraction and we have begun to look at money and what coins we use to pay for things. In History, we looked at some toys that our grandparents and great grandparents might have played with and compared them to toys we play with today. In Design and Technology we explored different types of puppets. Well done Year 1&2 for a super week of learning!
- Year Five & Six This week has involved a lot of strategical and methodical thinking, as we have been investigating division. Many of our children have never used this method before and some children found this quite challenging, but they did not give up and showed super resilience. In English, the children have now finally completed their Alfred the Great biographies and they are super!!!!. They include lots of facts and they have successfully used: subheadings, passive voice and third person pronouns. On Friday, we began our new unit that will lead us up to Christmas. We are studying films and playscripts, the children will discover how to write a playscript from a film clip, as well as predict events and generate character descriptions.

This week, we have also begun our new vocabulary scheme. The children will be introduced to 3 words a week and look at how they can use this word within their writing and speech. They will also generate synonyms and antonyms for the words; we are even representing the word pictorially! Next week, we are investigating Judaism, as a part of our whole school Faith week - I know the children will create some outstanding work. Have a lovely weekend.
