## **This Weeks Spotlight!**

### **Year Five & Six**

Another busy week in Year 5/6! The children began the week with the introduction of our new English unit of legends. The children are already really excited to hear more legends from around the UK. In mathematics the children have been developing their understanding of using the inverse for multiplication and addition.

In French, the children explored the different parts of the body and were trying heard to pronounce them correctly in class. Our scientific minds have also been stretched this week as the children have been identifying materials that can be reversed or if they are irreversible.

Our history lesson was very exciting this week - the children explored artefacts from the Viking era. They discussed what they thought it was, what they thought it was made of and where it came from. Each aspect had to racked up with evidence from the artefact. One which we were all very shocked about - ask them what it was!

Finally, we also selected our FBA Team (fantastic book awards). These children will read to the class every day and the class will select a winner of all the books we have.



#### **Classroom News!**

**EYFS** 

This week in EYFS we have used our new non-fiction text to help us talk about things we see in autumn. We went on an autumn walk around the grounds to see the changes happening and created an autumn journey stick. In Maths we have continued to look at the numbers 1, 2, and 3 and this week we have learnt how to subitise these numbers and how to represent them in different ways. In our outdoor area, the children have been exploring the mud kitchen and using pumpkins to make different recipes.

Year One & Two

What a great first week back after half term! Year 1&2 have enjoyed tasting and describing fruits and vegetables in English. We have been making human sentences and then writing some super sentences on our own. In maths, we have been learning about doubles and how to add 3 x 1-digit numbers together. We had a fun activity in history on Wednesday where we had a selection of photographs of staff members as babies, teenagers, and adults. We had to see if we could match them together to look at how we grow and change over time. Well done, Year 1&2!

Year Three & Four This week we have introduced our new topic The Romans and more specifically at the Queen of the Iceni Tribe, Boudicca. In English our focus this term is fables. We have been creating interest around our new book The Green Children and had lots of book talk discussions about what we can deduce from some of the beautiful illustrations. Our maths is now moving on to addition and subtraction and all our knowledge of place value is going to be really helpful. Finally our science topic took a spooky turn as we explored more magnetic forces and used this non-contact force to create some 'floating ghosts'.
