This Weeks Spotlight!

Year Five & Six

Another super busy week in Year 5/6, it was the end of our first week in our temporary classroom; well done to the children, as they have adjusted to the changes quickly. This week the children have come to the end of Good Night Mr Tom, which the children really enjoyed, we even had a few tears during the sad parts. Now, they are beginning to develop their ideas to write a WW2 'lost diary' of the main character William. In mathematics, we have had some more fabulous fractions. This week we have been developing our understanding of adjusting denominators to enable the children to sort, compare and order fractions.

We have come to the end of our Sources unit and the children will plan and enjoy their celebration part of the unit next week . They have enjoyed discussing the Gospel this week and they have investigated similarities and differences between the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John within the New Testament. In Geography, the children have had lots of fun finding out about the time zones around the world. Using Greenwich Mean Time and the meridian lines around the globe, the children investigated the different time zones and discovered how and why we have different time zones.



Classroom News!

- **EYFS** In EYFS this week we have continued to look at different celebrations from around the world. We have explored Carnival in Brazil and Holi in India. We made masks and spoke about the similarities and differences between them. In Literacy, we have started our new non-fiction text about plants. We have explored nonfiction books noticing the differences to a story. Then we labelled a plant as a class and spoke everything we knew about plants. In writing the children had the opportunity to label their own plant with all their knowledge. For Maths we have been exploring the numbers 6, 7, and 8; how they are made up, finding patterns and learning how to write them.
- Year One & Two This week we have been busy planning and writing our posters about 'rats'. The children have been using their newly learnt skills to write sentences that contain conjunctions and correct punctuation. In geography, we have looked at the physical and human features of Skelmersdale and Crosby Beach. In PE, we have been practising our throwing technique. Using a swinging under arm throw, aiming with our other arm and using a correct foot position. In science, we have been learning about the way animals change as they grow from babies to adults and in maths, we have started our new topic on multiplication. We have been learning about equal groups and even how to add them together through repeated addition. Well done Year 1&2!
- Year Three & Four This week in Year 3/4, we have become detectives exploring the missing case of Pongo and Missis' puppies! The children have been conducting their own investigation into who could possibly have stolen the puppies. They have then began writing their own character witness statements. In Geography, we have been looking at what landscapes can be found in the Lake District, as well as what animals we might find there. While in Music, we have begun learning some new chords on the ukulele. Well done team on another brilliant week!
