This Weeks Spotlight! Year Five & Six

A very busy final week in Autumn 1 for Year 5/6. The children have been exploring multiples in mathematics this week. They have been investigating multiples of 10 and then dividing and multiplying by powers of 10 (10, 100, 1000). In Religious Education, the children have discussed the word 'vocation' and investigated people's jobs or roles and how they help us to see God's special path for all of us and the role that he has selected for us all.

In History, the children have explored many of the fantastic inventions and explorations the Early Islamic peoples created many of which are still used today; ask the children to recall a couple for you. The children also investigated the early scholars and how they helped the world begin to read and write. In PE, the children have completed their striking and fielding unit of cricket, we definitely have some future

EYFS

This week in EYFS the children have been looking at the book Herbie's Big Adventure and speaking about where he could be going and why. The children then spoke about if we went on an adventure around our local area what would we see. As a class the children wrote their own directions to the playground and on Thursday we were able to go on a local area walk and follow those directions. Then on Friday the children then drew a map of our walk. In Maths we have started to look at numbers to 10 starting with 1, 2, and 3. The children have enjoyed exploring the numbers and how to write them. We had a fantastic half-term in EYFS and the children have worked very hard. Have a fantastic week off.

Year One & Two

Year 1&2 have had a great week. In English, we have been writing our own non-chronological reports on a dinosaur of our choice. In Maths, we have been learning how to use number lines to help us in our next topic addition and subtraction. We have also been looking at money, what coins we use and what they are worth. In History, we completed our learning about Learie Constantine. The children even wrote a thank you letter to Learie for all the amazing work he did to improve the lives of the migrants who came to Britain. In RE, the children began to learn about the first sacrament and enjoyed performing in a Baptism role play. Well done Year 1&2, enjoy your well-earned rest over half term!

Year Three & Four

This week in Year 3/4, we have been writing our non-chronological report on Ancient Egyptian Gods. The children have researched and collected information on four of the Egyptian Gods: Ra, Amun, Anubis and Osiris. The children then presented their information in the form of a non-fiction report. The outcomes are absolutely brilliant, and all the children worked very hard on their pieces. In Maths, we have come to the end of our Place Value unit and finished off the week exploring rounding numbers. All the children approached this very positively! While towards the end of the week, we created our designs for the Diocese Christmas Card competition - fingers crossed that we have a Y3/4 winner! Well done on a fabulous first half-term team!
