### **Classroom News!**

**EYFS** 

This week, we have continued with our story 'Shark in the Park on a Windy Day'. We created a story map as a class and made actions to help us retell it. The Reception children even drew their own story map! In maths, the nursery children have been subitising the numbers to 3. They were very good at it! The reception children have been finding 5 in the numbers 6-10 using number frames and rekenreks. We have also explored floating and sinking. The children have been finding lots of objects to test out in the water tray.

Year One & Two

Year 1&2 have had a brilliant week! We have been writing some interesting setting descriptions in English. In Maths, we have started our new topic on 'time' and the children have been concentrating so hard using their own mini clocks to show me what time it is. In Design & Technology, the children finished their plant pots and then in Science they planted some seeds. In RE we learnt more about Pentecost and how the Holy Spirit was sent by God

Year Three & Four

This week in Year 3/4 we've finished our unit on the Iron Man. The children had to write their own narrative based on the Ted Hughes novel. The children made their own hero who had to overcome a super-villain. The outcomes are all brilliant! In DT, the children have been experimenting with TinkerCAD - our new CAD software - to design some bridges. Finally in Science, we dissected plants to identify their different parts. Well done, team!
