This Weeks Spotlight!

Year One & Two

Year 1&2 have had another fantastic week. We have been busy planning and writing our own versions of the story 'Katie in London'. The children have chosen some London landmarks they would like to visit and even a famous statue to take them on a tour of the sights. In Geography, we have been learning more about each of the countries of the UK. We have learnt about the National flags, flowers and even some places of interest. During RE, we talked about how Jesus is the most special person for the parish family. We spoke about how we listen to God's word through the Gospels and how these tell the story of Jesus' life. During our Maths lessons we have been learning more about fact families, odd and even numbers and number bonds to 20. A few of the children even got to practise

their sewing skills earlier in the week, sewing details onto their puppets, we will continue this over the next few weeks. In Art, we explored some of the work by Pablo Picasso, linking his use of colour to emotions and the children produced some excellent portraits

Classroom News!

- EYFS This week, the children have continued with their learning on celebrations by learning about Chinese New Year. We talked about different ways that we celebrate different occasions and we watched a video on how Chinese New Year is celebrated. We remembered all the different ways that it is celebrated and compared it to our celebrations. The children then listened to the story of Chinese New Year and how every year is named after an animal. The children were then challenged to write as many of the animals as they could remember and make them from playdough.
- Year Three & Four This week in Year 3/4, we've been exploring what it would be like to be standing in front of a volcano. The children have used all their writing skills to produce a detailed description of the scene. In Maths, we've continued exploring our times tables through multiplication and division. While in Science, we've been investigating light. Well done on another brilliant week, team!
- Year Five & Six Year 5/6 have been working extremely hard this week to complete their final draft of their debate, the outcome has been wonderful. They have included emotive language, modals verbs and lots of language used in debate. In Maths, we have been exploring tricky fractions. The children have learnt to find equivalent fractions, convert a mixed number to an improper fraction and vice versa. Within our Geography unit, the children have been using atlases to focus in on the continent of South America. This week, Y5/6 have located where in the world the continent is and used atlases to locate the countries, borders and the capital cities. In RE, we have been exploring local charities in our area and discussing their role and how people can help others (mission) through kindness, care and selflessness.
