## This Weeks Spotlight!

Year 5/6 have came back to school after the Easter break full of vigour and ready to get straight back to work. This week we have began our design technology unit for this term 'create'. The children have been given the brief of producing a protein bar for a sports personality. We began by completing some research into the founder of cereal and what goes into a cereal bar. The children found a lot of information all about John Harvey Kellogg.

In English, we have begun our classic literature unit. We will be studying the Shakespearean play called Macbeth. The children have really enjoyed reading the text and acting the parts of the 'the witches'. They will be completing a modern version of the text at the end of the unit.

In PE, the children have begun invasion games - they had a lot of fun playing handball and football.

In mathematics, the children have been investigating decimals. We have discussed the relationship between fraction, decimals and percentages and discussing how to convert a decimal to a fraction.

The children have been making equal groups and sharing things equally. In English, we have been writing our own stories based on Traction Man.
