## **This Weeks Spotlight!**

## Year Three & Four

This week in English, Yr 3 & 4 have continued with our Paddington story stopping to consider the characters thoughts and points of view. We acted out scenes taking on different roles and also tried some grapefruit as we acted out Paddington having a rather messy breakfast in bed. All of this whilst remembering to use our new grammar - subordinate clauses.

Guided reading has got underway and we are working in our groups expanding our vocabulary - over dinnertime to see if they can explain: stowaway, prehistory, crestfallen, emigrate and frantically.

It has been great to see children accessing Reading Plus and TT Rockstars at home, it really does make a huge difference to their work. Another highlight this week was enjoying PE out in the sunshine. We were learning to dribble a basketball with both hands and shoot using the chest pass.

We investigated push and pull contact forces in science and their effects on different objects and will move on to non contact forces next week when we get our magnets. Finally, in history, we explored life as a Stone Age person and how simple acts like finding food or hunting would have been tough.

Wow we have been busy this week - enjoy the weekend rest everyone.















#### **Classroom News!**

**EYFS** 

What an exciting week we have had in EYFS. This week we have continued to read our story; Harry and the Dinosaurs go to school. The children had a go at retelling the story using puppets and made a class story map. We have also been talking about what it feels like to start a new school or class and how we feel. In Maths, we have been looking at sorting into two groups and matching similar items. Our topic this term is Home Sweet Home, so we have been discussing our families, the similarities and differences and what makes us special.

Year One & Two

This week in Year 1&2 we have started our new English topic on 'Harry the Happy Mouse'. We have been writing sentences describing who Harry has met along his journey and also what Harry might do. In maths, we have been learning about 1 more and 1 less and the children have done really well with this. In History, we looked at an artefact and spent a lot of time discussing what it was and what it might have been used for. In RE, we have been reflecting on God's creation, the world and how it is our responsibility to take care of it and our families. Well done Year 1&2!

Year Five & Six

This week in Year 5/6, the children have been investigating new vocabulary within the class text. We have also been introducing a range of new characters and the children have been discovering if the character is trustworthy or not by using the text as support. Within our science, the children have been investigating a range of different materials and identifying all their properties.

Our swimming schedule has begun once more, and the children have been having a lot of fun. Some children have now moved into the bigger pool and some children are now beginning their lessons from the deeper end of the pool - well done everyone!

In our Journey in love (RSE) programme, the children have been exploring how our relationships change as we get older and how our we can identify what a good and caring relationship should look like. In addition, the children have developed their knowledge and understanding of place value in mathematics- they are now working in the tens of millions!
