Year Five & Six

Year 5/6 has had a very productive week this week - as we have been preparing for our end of year school performance and the children are getting very excited. They have been learning all their lines - many not needing their scripts now 2. The performance date is Wednesday 10th July @ 5pm.

Also, this week, the children have been using water colour paints to paint a likeness of Monet water lilies; focusing on the detail in the foreground and the background. They complete this with using a range of paper and card to create a collaging effect - they are absolutely beautiful.

Our Year 5/6 scientists have been exploring pulse rates this week. They have been recording their pulse rate and then jumping about for a minute and then recording again. Finally, they looked at their resting heart rate in between.

Our Collective worship leaders have also been delivery collective worship in class this week; they planned the event and done a fantastic job - well done!

During this term's meeting, the children had to sequence a timeline and watched a video about voting and campaigning. They then discussed the upcoming general election, learning how the process starts- from the current prime minister requesting a general election, the dissolving of government, to voting age, how votes are made, new MPs and prime minister being elected.

EYFS

We have had an exciting week this week. On Tuesday we went on our trip to Windmill Animal Farm. Whilst we were there, we were able to feed the lambs and other farm animals, see George the pig, hold a snake, gecko and a tarantula and went on the farm train. The children really enjoyed learning about all the animals, and they were a credit to the school. Also, this week we have been singing the nursery rhyme Jack and Jill, then we drew and described the characters. In Maths, the children have been working on sharing and grouping. They have been working on sharing even and odd numbers and why odd numbers can't be shared equally. Finally, our caterpillars have now become chrysalides and have been moved to our butterfly net ready for them to hatch!

Year One & Two

Year 1&2 have had a busy week learning more about our Artist Gabi Jimenez. We have been using our painting and collaging skills to recreate some of Gabi's work. In English, we have been writing some seaside related tongue twisters and pyramid poems. In maths, we have been learning about quarter to and quarter past the hour and in science we have been learning about what plants need to survive. In RE, we have been learning more about forgiveness and the sacrament of reconciliation and how important it is to live by Jesus' rule to 'love God and one another'. Well done Year 1&2!

Year Three & Four

This week we've continued our study of the art work of Eileen Agar. We've created a series of art rubbings to examine the differenct textures.

We investigated the difference of Invertebrates known as 'Annelids' and 'Protozoa'. We looked at how these differed from insects.

We calculated the perimeters of number of objects. These included books, tables and pencils bags, but also larger areas such as display boards.
