# This Weeks Spotlight! Year 5/6

It has been an extra busy week in Year 5/6. We began the week with an introduction to places around the community in French. The children had the opportunity to discuss each place and use the verb for the action at each place. Following this, we discovered the chronology of the Ancient Greeks. The children explored the stories and poem of the Ancient Greeks and looked at the term 'marathon', which was taken from a Greek solider running to tell the Athenians that they had won the battle / war - running 24/5 miles. Each aspect was discussed and then the children had to place each event in the correct chronological order. On Tuesday, we also had a visit from CAFOD, introducing the children to how they can help others around the world with gifts from CAFOD during the Advent season. In science, the children have investigated voltage. They all made predictions of what would happen to the bulb as they added more and more cells to the circuit. Many children's predictions were correct. We have also celebrated our annual St Edmund of Abingdon Day in school. Father Kenny came to school and delivered a mass for us all to enjoy; Year 6 lead with the readings and bidding prayers.

In English, the children have been focusing on the reading phrase of our current unit. This week, the children have explored gathering information, retrieving information, scanning fo information, as well as reading for gist. Our work with fractions in class has definitely paid of as we had many children wanting to so their understanding on the whiteboards during the lesson. Finally, we finish this week with a little bit of fun, as the children had to work on pairs to create a rap song all about expectations and waiting for Christmas during the Advent season - there were many laughs and chuckles.



## **Classroom News!**

#### Year EYFS

This week in FSU the children have been learning about Advent and the importance of Advent wreaths in helping us to prepare for Christmas. The children enjoyed making their own Advent wreaths and we learnt that the wreath has three purple candles, one pink candle and a white candle which is lit on Christmas Day.

This week the children also learnt about St Edmund of Abingdon and we found out that he was a clever man who helped lots of people. In class, the children used collage materials to make their own St Edmund stained glass window. Reception also took part in this week's Mass with Father Kenny and I was very proud of how well they listened and behaved during the service.

In Maths, Reception have been learning about shapes with four sides. We explored the different shapes that can be found in four sided shapes and we went on a shape hunt to find real life examples of squares and rectangles. Nursery, have continued to compare amounts this week and use the vocabulary more than, fewer than and same to make comparisons between amounts. Nursery have also looked at 2D shapes this week and they explored flipping and rotating shapes to make them fit shape puzzles.

In Maths, we have been focusing on subtracting and finding the difference. The children have been using counting equipment and taking part in a range of practical carpet activities to help deepen their understanding.

In Come and See, we have been talking about preparations and how we prepare for our day, or for special events. The children have also started making their own Advent wreaths, which they are really enjoying.

This week, we also celebrated St Edmund of Abingdon Day with a lovely Mass in school.

Nativity practice is well underway! Children will be bringing their lines home this evening, so lots of practising at home, please, adults! All in all, another fabulous week!

At the start of the week, we marked St Edmund's Day and spent time in PSHE thinking about why he is our class saint and the values he represents. In maths, we focused on the 3, 6 and 9 times tables, exploring the clever connections between them. We continue our singing sessions preparing for the Young Voices concert in February and the Christmas carols also made an appearance as we get ready for some upcoming carolling.
