# This Weeks Spotlight! Year One & Two

What a great week in Year 1&2! We have started to write our own versions of The Highway Rat. The children have been working hard on their sentence structure and applying all of the grammar skills we have learnt over the last 6 weeks to make their writing more interesting. In maths, we have begun our new topic on shape. We have been checking our knowledge of both 3D and 2D shapes and next week we will start to look at their properties. As we are coming to the end of our geography topic on Skelmersdale and Port Douglas we have been learning about maps. What they are used for and how we can sketch our own. The children have enjoyed mapping around the school grounds and learning about compass directions. We have been learning about Lent in our RE lessons and the children have been enthralled with the











story of Holy Week. We were even lucky enough to visit St Paul's Church on Thursday to have the story retold to us through the 'Stations of the Cross'. It was an engaging, fun and informative session led by the vicar and his team. In PE, the children were throwing, kicking and passing to each other and in science, we have been learning about how to keep healthy. Using good hygiene, keeping fit and eating a balanced diet. Well done Year 1&2, you have all worked incredibly hard!



#### **Classroom News!**

**EYFS** 

This week in EYFS we have continued to look at non-fiction books and what makes it a non-fiction book. The children looked at page numbers, contents pages and discussed how it is different from a story. In Maths the children have started to explore the numbers 9 and 10. They started wit the formation of these and then compared the numbers to other numbers, using the language fewer and more than. In class we have also been looking at the forces pus and pull, sinking and floating then explored how magnets work. Today we had to say goodbye to our chicks. We have really enjoyed looking after them and watching them grow!

Year Three & Four

This week in Year 3/4, we've been learning about the Water Cycle and how the water we have on our planet is constantly changing state thanks to the process of evaporation, condensation, precipitation and collection. On Thursday, we had a wonderful trip to St Paul's church. During our visit, we explored the different stations of the cross - retelling the story of Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection. In Maths, we have been using a number line to count in fractions greater than one. While in English, we have been writing and editing our own stories based on 101 Dalmatians. Well done on a brilliant week team!

Year Five & Six

This week in Year 5/6, we have begun our new English unit of Limericks. We identified the structure and the language used within a limerick. The children had a lot of laughs reading and making up their own limericks. In Geography, the children have been using Digimaps for Schools program to look at our locality and begin to recognise four and six-digit grid references.

In RE, we have come to the end of our Unity unit, and we have begun to look at and discuss death and new life. This units reflects the Easter session and how Jesus was crucified and then rose again. Tear 5/6 had a very enjoyable PE lesson also yesterday, as the children played a game of dodgeball and you could hear their laughter inside the building.
