Year Five & Six

This week has been extremely busy in Year 5/6. We have been investigating the Ten Commandments in RE and discussing the role of Moses and the escape of the Israelites. The children produced their own commandments for Christians today. In swimming, they have had a dry swim lesson in school learning all about the dangers in a body of water and the safe guidance for swimming outside and in a pool. We also visited the swimming pool for a drowning prevention week.

In DT, the children have been out and about collecting resources for the big hotels - they will put all this together next week from the designs that they have already made. Finally, our performance rehearsals are getting under way and the children seem extremely excited.













Classroom News!

EYFS

This week we had another visit from the emergency services. The Police came in to speak to us about their jobs. They showed us the different types of hats and uniforms they wear, and we were able to try them on! In Maths this week we have been looking at shape. The children described what the shapes looked like and combined them to make different objects. As part of our Wonderful World topic, we tried different types of fruit and voted on which ones we liked best!

Year One & Two

This week we enjoyed our school trip to The Blue Planet. It was a great day out and we had so much fun. In English, we have been planning and writing the beginning of our 'Rainbow Fish' stories. We have been thinking about our sentence structure and including some interesting adjectives to improve our writing. In Maths, we have been learning about the properties of 3D shapes and in Science we enjoyed planting some beans and setting up our investigation to see what plants need to grow. In PE, we enjoyed controlling tennis balls with tennis racquets and in Music we finished our 'Imagination' topic. Well done Year 1&2!

Year Three & Four This week in Year 3/4, we have been exploring traditional tales and folk tales. The children have been looking at the digital literacy clip - the Little Shoemaker. The clip is about a shoemaker whose inventions keep getting copied by an unusual man who has recently just appeared in the town. The children have been generating vocabulary, finding synonyms and antonyms and experimenting with figurative devices to create descriptions. In our Maths unit, we have been exploring tenths and hundredths as decimals. While in swimming, we learned about how to stay safe in the water - we even had to enter the pool in our pjs! Well done on a brilliant week team!


