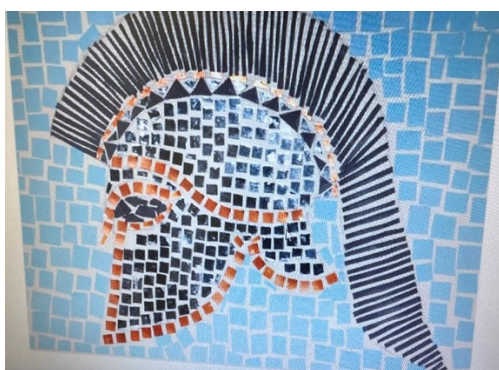
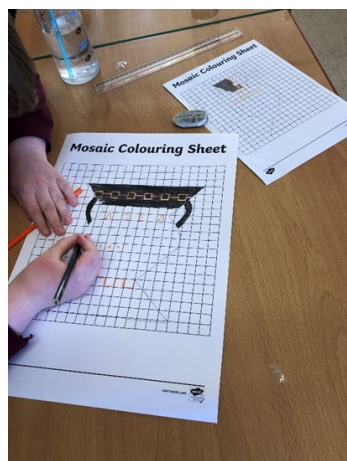
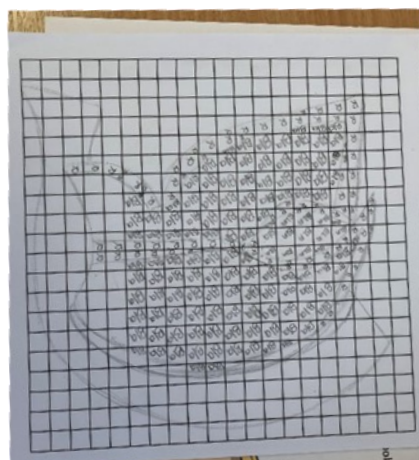
This Weeks Spotlight!
