This Weeks Spotlight!

Year Five & Six

Year 5/6 has been very creative this week. The children have been completing their sculptor within art & design. The children created a sporting pose with wire. The structure had to be able to stand on its own. Once the children had completed this session, they then used mod-roc (which is very similar to plaster of Paris). They had to layer and wrap the mod-roc around the sculptor. The outcome was amazing.

In Design Technology, the children have been given a design brief of making a protein bar for a sporting personality of their choice. We began by taste testing products and researching packaging. The children then designed their own packaging choice and followed a set of ingredients and a method to make a protein bar.

In English, the children completed a very interesting explanation of The Teacher Pleaser Machine as a whole class, followed by their own ideas for the Snoozatron machine. They used a range of wonderful Noun phrases to describe the machine, as well as relative clauses, using which and whose.

EYFS

We have had an exciting final week in EYFS. Throughout this week we have been looking at our story; The Jolly Postman and actions to remember th story. Then we changed some of the characters and made-up new actions to make our own story. Then in our writing we had a go ourselves. In Maths, we have continued to look at the numbers 14 to 20 and how they can be represented. Nursery have been exploring 3D shapes and their properties. We also made our final DT piece on Friday; Frozen Yoghurt Faces. The children tasted different types of fruit and yoghurt and then used this to design their own faces . Using the designs the children then made their frozen faces.

Year One & Two

What a great week in Year 1&2. On Tuesday we were shocked when we arrived into class and the chairs had quit! We had to write letters of persuasion to ask them to come back as we realised how much we actually need them! In maths, we have been dividing by 5 and 10 and the children have been writing some amazing number sentences. We have been really busy completing our art unit on Anthony Gormley. The children used clay to made some fantastic 'Another Place' sculptures. We also finished our design and technology unit by making a healthy salad on Friday. The children selected their ingredients based on appearance, taste and texture. We hope you enjoy them. Have a lovely half term break Year 1&2!

Year Three & Four

What a creative week in year 3 & 4! We have sewn and sewn and the children have shown resilience, tenacity and mastered a few skills along the way. They have smashed the DT brief to design and make a drawstring bag - they all function and look terrific! A big thank you to the parents who gave up their free time to come in and help the children. We concluded our warrior queen narrative in English and the independent writes look very impressive, I look forward to reading them over the half term. In maths, we finished our fractions unit looking at how to calculate a fraction of an amount. The children are all talking like mathematicians and know to divide by the denominator and times by the numerator. The MTC (multiplication times table check) is looming when we get back so all children, especially the year 4s, will be spending 10 minutes a day practicing their times tables on TTRS, I know we will smash that too! Reminder

Just a gentle reminder in relation to holidays:

If you want to take your child our of school for a holiday if their attendance is 96% or above, you will not be fined.

If the time the children are absent for is 4 and a half days within a 10 week period, you will not be fined.

If you take your child out of school and their attendance is below 96% or they are absent for more than 4 and a half days within a 10 week period, you will be fined. If you are away for 3 days and then 2 days at a separate occasion within a 10 week period you will be fined. Most schools will fine even if a child's attendance is over 96%. We at, St. Edmund's, have made the decision not fine if a children's attendance is 96% or above because we want to work with parents.


